This coming Sunday is Palm Sunday, also called Passion Sunday. A couple things will be different this year. One, the palms that you will receive have been purchased through Eco Palms <https://www.ecopalms.org/>. This Fair Trade group is

promoted by Lutheran World Relief for its commitment to providing a higher percentage of the income to the actual laborers. There is also a commitment to sustainable agricultural practices which is better for the environment.

The second change this year is reverting back to reading only the "Palm Sunday" part of Luke's gospel versus the traditional reading of the full Passion Narrative. The typical Palm/Passion Sunday begins with the processional gospel then continues all the way through the crucifixion for the primary gospel reading. Some of you may like this change, others will not; many may not have noticed unless I mentioned it! But for this year, Palm Sunday will remain as the first Sunday in Holy Week.

Then you are invited to come back for the special liturgies of Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. (more on those next week!)

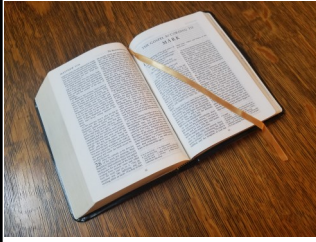
# *An Orchestra of Voices*

### ***CPR and Child Safety Training Saturday, May 4<sup>th</sup> at 10:00 a.m.***

The University Lutheran Church Wellness Ministry is pleased to offer a Child & Babysitting Safety Course for youth ages 11-17 years and Friends & Family CPR for adults on Saturday, May 4<sup>th</sup>. Training will be provided by *CPR First Aid 101* of Greenville SC. Both courses are designed to equip participants with the necessary knowledge and skills to properly respond to certain emergency situations at home, at work, or anywhere else. #### **Child and Babysitting Safety Course - 2 Hours**

This course provides basic knowledge and hands on skills in caring for infants and children, including CPR/AED/Choking and course completion card. This card is NOT American Heart Association (AHA) certification. This course is designed for **Youth age 11-17 years**. Cost is \$50 per student.

#### **Friends and Family CPR training - 1 Hour**

This course provides basic skills of CPR/AED and relieving an obstructive airway in adults, children and infants. CPR booklet provided. This course does NOT provide AHA certification. This course is designed for adults. Cost is \$40 per student.

Please note that the above courses **DO NOT** provide an American Heart Association certification that may be required for work as a Lifeguard, Nursery or Daycare attendant. If you need the AHA certification, please let Lena know as she **may** be able to arrange the appropriate *CPR* training with *CPR First Aid 101*. Cost for this training is \$95 for a four-hour course.

**\*\*Adult, Infant CPR & First Aid training** is also available with the City of Clemson on May 4<sup>th</sup> from 8 am-1 pm for a cost of \$50 for residents and \$75 for non-residents. Space is limited to 10 participants. Courses are also available through Clemson University.
