The May, September and October Book Selections For A Novel Bunch

Our May book selection is *Where the Crawdads Sing* by Delia Owens which was published in 2018. A reviewer for *The New York Times Book Review* writes the following about this novel:

"Painfully beautiful . . . At once a murder mystery, a coming-of-age narrative, and a celebration of nature."

After our May meeting, we go on sabbatical and will return to our regular club meeting schedule on Thursday, September 19th. Our September book selection is *The Frontiersmen* by Allan W. Historical figures like Daniel Boone will come alive in this lengthy narrative. This book would make a good summer read. Our October book selection is *The Other Einstein* by Marie Benedict published in 2016. *The Other Einstein* is about Milvea Maric, the brilliant Serbian physicist and first wife of Albert Einstein.

Recycling Guidelines

UniLu now has four **green buckets** from Clemson for curbside recycling. Clemson doesn't pick up from the curb from businesses like our church, but those of you who live in Clemson can take home one of the full green buckets (located next to the fridge in the upstairs kitchen) and place it on your curb. When it's been emptied, please return the bucket to the church kitchen.

Although there are many things besides the **items below that can be recycled**, **please place only these things in the green containers because these are what Clemson accepts:**

***Plastics #1-5 (empty, with lids removed)**

***All #1 Pet-soft drink containers (empty, lids removed)**

***All tin cans and aluminum cans**

***Brown, clear, and green glass (empty, lids removed)**

***Cereal boxes**

***Newspaper**

Note the following items are NOT on the list: aluminum casserole pans, wrappers, paper like bulletins, corrugated cardboard. Please do NOT put these items in the green bins in the kitchen.

(Our church office does have paper recycling. If you would like to recycle your bulletin or other paper, please leave it on the round table in the narthex after church or drop off other paper at the church office.)

Thanks for your help on using Clemson recycling's guidelines for the green bins in the kitchens. It makes it easier for volunteers who take the bins home to provide recycling to our community!

We're looking for at least four people to volunteer to take home the green recycling buckets about once a month.

***CPR and Child Safety Training
Saturday, May 4th at 10:00 a.m.***

The University Lutheran Church Wellness Ministry is pleased to offer a Child & Babysitting Safety Course for youth ages 11-17 years and Friends & Family CPR for adults on **Saturday, May 4th**. Training will be provided by *CPR First Aid 101* of Greenville SC. Both courses are designed to equip participants with the necessary knowledge and skills to properly respond to certain emergency situations at home, at work, or anywhere else. Child and Babysitting Safety Course - 2 Hours

This course provides basic knowledge and hands on skills in caring for infants and children, including CPR/AED/Choking and course completion card. This card is NOT American Heart Association (AHA) certification. This course is designed for **Youth age 11-17 years**. Cost is \$50 per student.

Friends and Family CPR training - 1 Hour

This course provides basic skills of CPR/AED and relieving an obstructive airway in adults, children and infants. CPR booklet provided. This course does NOT provide AHA certification. This course is designed for adults. Cost is \$40 per student.

Please note that the above courses **DO NOT** provide an American Heart Association certification that may be required for work as a Lifeguard, Nursery or Daycare attendant. If you need the AHA certification, please let Lena know as she **may** be able to arrange the appropriate *CPR* training with *CPR First Aid 101*. Cost for this training is \$95 for a four-hour course.

**Adult, Infant CPR & First Aid training is also available with the City of Clemson on May 4th from 8 am-1 pm for a cost of \$50 for residents and \$75 for non-residents. Space is limited to 10 participants. Courses are also available through Clemson University.
