## The May, September, and October Book Selections For A Novel Bunch

Our May book selection is *Where the Crawdads Sing* by Delia Owens which was published in 2018. A reviewer for *The New York Times Book Review* writes the following about this novel:

"Painfully beautiful . . . At once a murder mystery, a coming-of-age narrative, and a celebration of nature."

Our October book selection is *The Other Einstein* by Marie Benedict published in 2016. *The Other Einstein* is about Milvea Maric, the brilliant Serbian physicist and first wife of Albert Einstein.

## Libby Hoyle to be Honored by Clemson Cooperative Extension

Libby Hoyle (Queener) will be inducted Saturday, May 18 into the 2019 class of the A. Frank Lever County Extension Agent Hall of Fame. She is joined in this year's group by three other long-time Extension professionals.

Libby is being recognized for exceptional service to the citizens of South Carolina during her 35 years as part of the Clemson Cooperative Extension staff. Libby began her career working in county extension programs serving SC youth through 4-H and teaching low-income families food choices and preparation techniques to improve nutrition and save money. Later, as an Extension specialist, she was the "Voice of Clemson Extension" to residents of South Carolina as she hosted the popular "Your Day" program broadcast statewide on SC Public Radio.

Libby was named PSA Employee of the Year, honored by the National Association of Extension Home Economists and the National Restaurant Assn. for her leadership in developing and implementing the ServSafe food service employee food safety training... now in use all across the US. According to a recent publication, ServSafe through the years has awarded nearly 4 million ServSafe Food Protection Manager Certifications.

Established five years ago on the 100th anniversary of the Cooperative Extension Service, the Lever Hall of Fame was created to honor the careers of "longtime, front-line county agents" whose work had an important economic impact on the communities they served.

The program bears the name of U.S. Rep. A. Francis "Frank" Lever of South Carolina, co-author of the Smith-Lever Act of 1914 that created the Extension Service nationally. Lever, a Lexington County native and Clemson trustee, envisioned a national program that would take research-based agricultural and food-science knowledge from colleges and universities and put it in the hands of working people it would benefit.

If my wife had not given me these meals, I would be physically dead today. Likewise, if I had not gone to church for nourishment, I would be spiritually dead today!"
