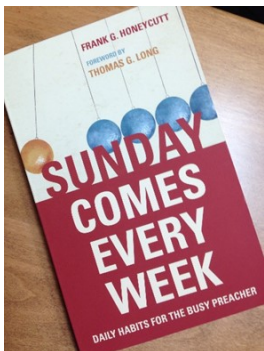




From Pastor Jon
