From Pastor Jon

Y'all have been through a lot of change these past couple of years, and are about to undergo your most significant staff change in close to three decades. Three decades! Pastor Chris has not only been an excellent Campus Pastor, he's also been the continuity through three different Parish Pastors. This was a dynamic I was cognizant of when going through the call process, and Pastor Chris and I have talked freely about it.

So, in Martin Luther's words, "What does this mean?" It means that you will soon be saying goodbye to a beloved person who has played a special role in your life.

In Pastor Chris' own words:

"It is helpful, at the time of a resignation, to remind ourselves of the nature of the relationship between Pastor and Congregant. It is a sacred relationship. It is a functional relationship. A pastor serves a function, for the sake of the Church and on behalf of the Christ whom we worship. The sacred aspects of one's relationship with their Pastor are folded into those functional roles. One is "pastor" when one functions as such. I will forever remain your brother, your friend, a fellow disciple. But on August 16, 2019 I will no longer be your pastor. Therefore, I will not be available for baptisms, weddings, funerals or other pastoral acts. I will no doubt see you at the grocery store, on-campus lectures, and hopefully at more than a few gatherings of the wider Church. We do not need to avoid each other, or fail to share events in our lives. We simply must remember that God has called us to new relationships and that these new relationships deserve our greater dedication."

One of my most significant responsibilities I identified to Council a few years ago was to assist in the transition for the next Campus Pastor. This includes saying goodbye well to Pastor Chris, and creating enough space for Pastor Josh to work with the Student Leaders, students, LCM Directing committee and congregation in writing the next chapter for LCM.


