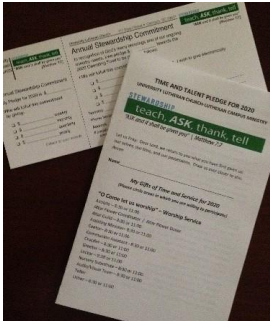

Where: Clemson United Methodist Church

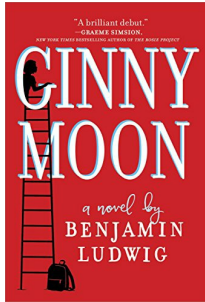
