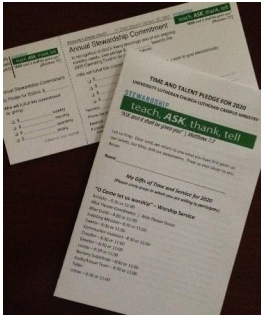
Hmmm...Gathering for a meal...laughter and joy...serving and encouraging

Pastor Jon and Renee will once again be making their wonderful shredded beef tacos!

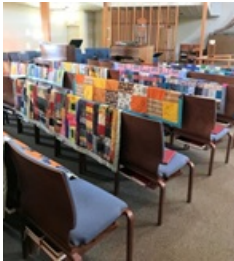
What you can do:

- Come to the event: Each dollar you spend gets you a serving of great food prepared by clergy in Clemson. We need you to eat all this wonderful food!

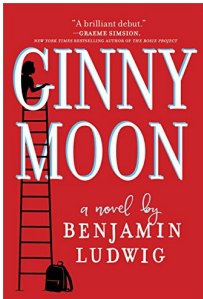

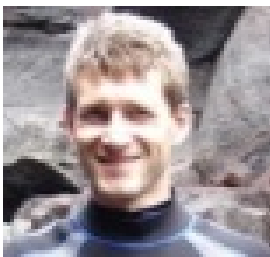
leprosy missions
