### **From Pastor Jon**

I am grateful to Lena Jones for her article on Covid-19 (see below) and what we can be doing to help protect ourselves and our neighbors. The next two to four weeks will be crucial in our ability to mitigate the damage done to friends, families, neighbors and strangers. Renee and I have cancelled our April trip to

California; missing two family weddings and seeing our grandkids is disappointing to say the least, but since we made our decision TSA agents at San Jose and LAX Airports have tested positive for the virus. Personally, Renee and I are in good health although we are inching closer to the 60 year mark. But, if we were to become exposed/infected, and with an incubation period of up to 14 days without any symptoms, it wasn't a risk we wanted to take on behalf of everyone we would subsequently come in contact with.

Regarding the congregation, as of Wednesday morning at 10 AM, we still plan on having our 6PM Thursday night Lenten meal followed by worship at 7PM. Our Sunday worship services are still planned although we encourage you to refrain from shaking hands in the coming weeks. Our sermons are posted to the University Lutheran Clemson Facebook page, if you decide to stay at home for a week or two. A tip I picked up from a colleague was to put the trash cans outside of the bathrooms to remind people that after washing your hands use the paper towel for use on the door handle, then throw it away. Millions of people individually doing wise things can have a dramatic, positive effect in slowing the spread, or "flattening the curve"

Ways You Can Protect Your Family and Help Slow the Spread of CoronaVirus in Our Community

Greater numbers of people are being infected with

the COVID-19 coronavirus. Below are steps we can take immediately to reduce our risk of getting and spreading the virus within our community.

• Proper and frequent hand washing with soap and water for 20 seconds. Avoid touching eyes, nose and mouth. Use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol if soap and water are not available.

• Cover your coughs and sneezes with a tissue. Avoid touching your eyes, nose, or mouth with unwashed hands.

 $\cdot$  Abstain from close contact with sick individuals.

• *If you are sick, stay home! If someone in your house is sick, stay home* to avoid unknowingly spreading the virus to others.

• Clean and disinfect objects and surfaces with approved cleaners.

• If you are at higher risk for serious illness from COVID-19 because of your age or because you have a serious long-term health problem, take extra measures to reduce your risk of getting sick with the disease. Put distance between yourself and other people to further reduce your risk of being exposed to this new virus.

• Check in with family and friends who live alone—especially those with chronic diseases. If you live alone, ask your friends and family to check in with you if you become sick.
