Although I have been "with" many of you on Zoom gatherings these last six months, there is no substitute for real flesh and blood, even if we have to remain 6' apart and wearing masks. I think this speaks to the power of the incarnation; of God being incarnated in Jesus the Christ. Instead of waving some wand from the distant heavens, God entered into the fullness of our humanity, the joys and the suffering, the beauty and the ugliness. This God, Emanuel, has promised to be with us always, even to the end of the age. Expressions of this presence are found through God's living word written in scripture and fulfilled in Jesus. LCM UPDATE

Tonight will be our first time gathering in person after some weeks of caution. We had a couple of positive COVID tests in the group, so we responded by postponing our activities for two weeks and encouraging students to be tested if

they had been exposed.

Fortunately, we did not have any subsequent positive test results, which ensures that the precautions we have been taking as a group have been important. This did, though, reinforce that the pandemic is serious, and we will continue to take it seriously when we meet in the weeks ahead.

Action Item: When students or their roommates and close friends test positive, they are forced to self-quarantine for at least two weeks. We've started to compile a sort of "quarantine pantry" to help support students if/when they find themselves in a situation like this. Some simple groceries (mac & cheese, canned soup, snacks, toothpaste, toilet paper, etc.) could go a long way if a student finds themselves suddenly unable to go to the store. If

THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

Two of the readings for today from the *Word in Season* have the same powerful thought. Both are familiar stories from the Bible and had a new message for me that is important in these times in which we are living.

The first story is from the 50th chapter of Genesis, verses 15 to 26. Jacob has just died in Egypt. Joseph's brothers are concerned now that Jacob has died that Joseph will hold a grudge and pay them back for selling him into slavery in Egypt. Joseph tells them, "You intended to harm me, but God intended it for good to accomplish what is now being done, the saving of many lives." Jacob's family had survived the famine in the land and was safe in Egypt.

The second story is from the 11th chapter of Mark's gospel, verses 20-25. Earlier, Jesus had cursed a fig tree that was not producing figs. The next day the fig tree was withered. Jesus then tells the disciples about the power of prayer in verses 22 - 24, "Have faith in God. ... Therefore I tell you, whatever you ask for in prayer, believe that you have received it, and it will be yours." God may not answer our prayers the way we think he should, but, if we believe, he WILL answer them.

God can take a bad situation and make good come out of it. This is not saying that God causes bad things to happen to his people. We live in a fallen world. Our prayers may not be answered the way we want and on our time table. There is still evil and sin in this world. Covid-19 and racial injustice are still with us. But God is also still with us. I love the way Pastor Elizabeth Jaeger of St. Luke Lutheran Church in Sheboygan Falls, Wisconsin ends her devotion.

"But God is always at work, bringing about good for a numerous people, including us."



- Council has requested that the pastors not have in-person pastoral visits, except in the case of life-threatening emergency.
- Pastors will use telecare or other methods for the duration of this public health emergency.

- Church administrative assistant, Abi Donhauser will work remotely from her home office. She can be reached during normal office hours Monday Thursday, 7 am to 12 noon & 1 pm to 2:30 pm; Friday 8 am to 12 noon at 864-722-5504 or by email; unilusecretary@gmail.com.
- LCM meals will be provided as boxed/to-go meals rather than usual group meals. A small number of people will help with meal preparation.
- This public health emergency may leave people feeling isolated. To combat this, Council and others in the congregation, who desire to do so, (volunteers are welcome!) will be asked to contact others regularly to check in (lists will be provided).
- Church facilities remain available to congregation members, but we suggest that this be for INDIVIDUALS ONLY AND NOT FOR GATHERINGS/MEETINGS. Please thoroughly sanitize after use.
