The old testament reading for today in the common lectionary is from Proverbs. This is a book of the bible that I am not too familiar with, but the more I read from it, the more I want to read it. The reading for today is from the 8th chapter of Proverbs. Wisdom is speaking.

Proverbs 8:17:

I love those who love me, and those who seek me find me.

I have never seen a time in my life when there has been so much discussion about what is true in this country. I love the words of Paul Lutter, an ELCA pastor and writer from Plymouth, Minnesota, who writes in today's devotion from the *Word in Season*.

In a world ripped apart at the seams so that no one knows what is true, or where truth can be found, these verses give us guidance and encouragement. Wisdom, truth, and love have not only become flesh; they are also available to us. We find Wisdom when we seek her in the word and the water, in the bread and the wine. 
SOUPER BOWL OF CARING
