One of the verses that Sarah Young used in her Jesus Calling devotion for yesterday (February 9) spoke to me.

#### Isaiah 12:2:

"Surely God is my salvation; I will trust and not be afraid. The Lord, the Lord himself, is my strength and my defense; he had become my salvation."

Annual Reports will be emailed out to everyone on Friday, February 19th, so watch for them in your inbox that day.




Dear Congregation,


