## **THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK**



The psalm in the common lectionary for the first part of this week is Psalm 84. The psalmist was barred from going to the temple, perhaps when the Assyrians

ravaged Judah. Verses 1 and 2 reflect his situation.

Psalm 84:1-2:

"How lovely is your dwelling place, Lord Almighty! My soul yearns, even faints, for the court of the Lord; my heart and my flesh cry out for the living God."

The psalmist remarks that even the sparrow has found a home in God's house. He also remembers the pilgrimages to Jerusalem that he did in the past.

The last year has given us some feel for how the psalmist felt. It has been a year since we worshipped in our sanctuary as a congregation. The last year has been very different - although very special in other ways. Thanks to Ned and Myrna Johnson, Pastor Josh, and Pastor Jon, we have developed an amazing online presence for the church. Thanks to Judi and Rebecca, we have wonderful music. We can start each day with a morning devotion from one of the pastors.
