FROM PASTOR JON

Yesterday the CDC released "Interim Public Health Recommendations for Fully Vaccinated People" which can be found at this link:

My biggest takeaway is that for our outdoor worship services, if you have been vaccinated, they feel it's safe to not wear a mask (except in "large" gatherings.) I will probably continue to do so during the time of communion distribution, but forgo it for the other parts of the service. Of course, I'm not sitting near anyone so your choice may differ. And I expect that dynamic to continue for the foreseeable future.

Different contexts call for different responses. Everyone has their own comfort threshold and many have different personal or home situations to also consider. I'm not sure if my Ethics Professor taught me this, or I just heard it, but I believe he said that a Lutheran Ethic is rooted in "How does my action/inaction affect my neighbor?" Notice this isn't, "What do I want to do?" or "What do others tell me I should do?" It's a question I have to ponder as to how my action/inaction expresses love towards my neighbor. Compound that with God's clear words through the prophets and the addendum could well be, "...especially my neighbors who are most vulnerable."

It has been great gathering for worship outdoors and this past weekend to

meet a few people who have connected with University Lutheran these last fourteen months through our online worship and devotions. This Sunday, May 2, we will begin the process of re-introducing people into the sanctuary by having up to 30 people present during the 9 AM online service. We emailed the link to sign up this past Monday afternoon and as of Wednesday morning at 8 AM 10 of the 30 slots had been reserved. THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

The new testament lesson for today in the revised common lectionary is the very familiar story from Mark 14:26-31. Jesus and his disciples have finished

their Last Supper. Jesus predicts that all of the disciples will fall away. Peter and Jesus have this conversation.

Mark 14:29-30:

"Peter declared, 'Even if all fall away, I will not.'

'Truly I tell you,' Jesus answered, 'today - yes, tonight - before the rooster crows twice you yourself will disown me three times.' "

We all know what happened that night. Peter did deny Christ three times. Semi-retired Pastor Darlene Muschett from Lord of the Mountains Lutheran Church in Dillon, Colorado, shows what happened to Peter after Jesus' resurrection in her devotion for today in *The Word in Season*.

"In Mark 16:7, the angel singled out Peter to receive the news of the resurrection: 'But go, tell his disciples and Peter.' In John 21:15-17, the risen

Christ appeared to the disciples and asked Peter three times if he loved Jesus
- one time for each of Peter's denials. Peter was made whole - restored in
relationship to Jesus. There is no expiration date on God's forgiveness. No
matter how far we've pulled away from God, God won't pull away from
us. Daily we're made new through the forgiveness and love of Jesus."

We all have our Peter moments when we either deny or forget about Jesus and what he did for us on the cross. God is always there waiting for us to turn back to him. Thanks be to God.
