Although difficult to detect since they are virtually without leaves and the stems blend beautifully with the mulch behind, we now have three new shrubs on the hill by the lower parking lot. And

these shrubs have a neat history; at least to me.

They originated in the Ringeisen's yard. Several years ago Carolyn & Rich were in the process of thinning them out and invited me to dig some up. Having never transplanted an oakleaf hydrangea I was more than willing to experiment. All five shrubs not only survived the move, they seemed to enjoy the new location in our yard. And now, a few years later, having

begun to spread out they could be thinned once again, yielding three new shrubs. Nature's abundance; God's abundance.

When the Property Committee had the junipers removed from these slopes we began to envision what might take their place. The benefits of adding native plants and shrubs to a yard or landscape helps with building ecological diversity, not to mention that oakleaf hydrangeas have beautiful blooms in the spring, interesting leaves in the summer and stunning fall foliage. https://hgic.clemson.edu/factsheet/hydrangea/

FLOWERS FOR OUR WORSHIP SPACE

The new pages for the coming year have now been placed in the flower book in the narthex so that you may sign up to donate flowers to beautify our worship space. You can sign up for one arrangement or for two arrangements. There is space on the sign-up pages for you to dedicate the flowers in honor or memory of someone.

There are two options for providing flowers on the date you have selected. One is to create an arrangement (or two) yourself, if that is something you like to do. The second option is to have your arrangement(s) done by Tiger Lily Flowers. The order for flowers is placed with Tiger Lily Flowers by our flower coordinator. Tiger Lily bills the church monthly for flowers that have been ordered, rather than bills sent to the individuals giving the flowers. When the Sunday approaches for which you have signed up, a check for payment for flowers should be made out to University Lutheran Church, with the word "Flowers" on the memo line. The current cost for a beautiful arrangement done by Tiger Lily is \$48.15 which includes taxes and delivery fee. When two arrangements are ordered for a Sunday, the \$10.00 delivery fee is split between the two arrangements (\$43.15 for an arrangement.)

Flower donors are invited to take their arrangements home following the 11 am worship service to be enjoyed at home or shared with family or friends. Flowers are in a removable container, so the outer pot remains at the church.

Thanks to all of you who have provided flowers in the past and who will do so for coming Sundays.
