FROM PASTOR JOSH

Repair vs. resurrection. Last week several LCMers and I spent the week in Virginia helping to build a front porch for a home that needed one. The old porch had succumbed to age and gravity, and it was no longer safe for the family.

As we look ahead to the miracle of Easter, I'm wondering how to reconcile the need for repairs in a world where we're hoping/waiting for a resurrection. Our faith tells us that God's promises are for a better future than whatever reality we're currently faced with. But there is no timeline for that. In the meantime, how do we find ways to repair, restart, reenergize, repurpose, reorient, etc.? What keeps us going when we desperately wish God would intervene? Who do we turn to? How do we care

for one another? These are reflections for Lent as we continue to wait for the glory to come.

You may or may not have noticed the small but important change made recently to our order of worship. The prelude is now offered before the announcements are made by Pastor Josh. LCM DISCERNMENT SEQUENCE

Our search for an LCM Pastor begins with the submission of our Mission Specific Profile (MSP) to Bishop Ginny Aebischer. This multipage document spells out who we are, what we believe in as a parish, and the setting in which it all takes place. She and her team will use this document to depict us to all of the candidates who apply. The bishop's office will refer the top three candidates for an initial review by Pastor Josh. He will then refer all those who pass the initial screening to the Call Committee. Next, the Call Committee will interview each referred candidate either once or twice depending on the outcome. Once the Call Committee identifies their preferred candidate, they will recommend him or her to the Church Council. The Church Council interviews the candidate and hopefully confers the candidate to the congregation. Some type of "meet & greet" would then be organized to allow both the LCM student community and our parish worshipers to make his or her acquaintance. After which, a special discernment congregational meeting would be called. The candidate must receive at least two thirds vote to be called and his or her compensation package must be approved by a simple majority.
