We've made it to Ash Wednesday. Does it feel like the weeks are flying by, or is that just me? Today I'm trying to settle into some self-examination for the season of Lent. And I'm leaning on these words that I've offered to students the past few years:

Day after day we do our best to get good grades, to manage our money, to be kind to the people we meet, and to balance the many commitments we have made. It can be exhausting. The season of Lent is an opportunity to slow down. It gives us a chance to breathe, to think, and to reorient our lives towards the things that matter most. On Ash Wednesday, receive a cross of ashes on your forehead and hear these words: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." These words are meant to be humbling. And they are also a blessing. We are reminded that we cannot and that we do not need to try to do this on our own.

Embracing Inclusivity was last year's capital initiative to improve the exterior accessibility of our buildings by adding motorized digital access doors, installing compliant ramps, and modernizing the bathrooms in the educational/administration wing.

The fund-raising campaign for the initiative will end 30 June 2025. As of this writing we have not raised sufficient funds to cover the project (Cost: \$126,870.00, Raised: \$110,520.13).
