#### MOVIE SUGGESTION FOR LENT

Many folks may not have heard of the movie "The Shack"; a 2017 American drama film based on the 2007 novel of the same name. After suffering a family tragedy, Mack Phillips spirals into a deep depression that causes him to question his innermost beliefs. Facing a crisis of faith, he receives a mysterious, personal invitation to meet with God at "The Shack." This invitation will bring him face to face with God, where God's manifestations appear in nontraditional forms. The film deals with some deep spiritual issues about the nature of God and in particular about sacrificial love, making it very appropriate for the Lenten Season. Of course some predictable clichés are thrown in; and there is a surprise ending. The theology presented may not be completely 'Lutheran'; but it will make you think about spiritual things more deeply – which after all is the main point of Lent.

## LCM DISCERNMENT SEQUENCE

Our search for an LCM Pastor begins with the submission of our Mission Specific Profile (MSP) to Bishop Ginny Aebischer. This multipage document spells out who we are, what we believe in as a parish, and the setting in which it all takes place. She and her team will use this document to depict us to all of the candidates who apply. The bishop's office will refer the top three candidates for an initial review by Pastor Josh. He will then refer all

those who pass the initial screening to the Call Committee. Next, the Call Committee will interview each referred candidate either once or twice depending on the outcome. Once the Call Committee identifies their preferred candidate, they will recommend him or her to the Church Council. The Church Council interviews the candidate and hopefully confers the candidate to the congregation. Some type of "meet & greet" would then be organized to allow both the LCM student community and our parish worshipers to make his or her acquaintance. After which, a special discernment congregational meeting would be called. The candidate must receive at least two thirds vote to be called and his or her compensation package must be approved by a simple majority.

# CLEMSON COMMUNITY CARE FACTS

In 2024, CCC distributed 341,241 pounds of food.

• The average food distributed per day is 1,600

pounds.

• Food is valued at \$1.97 per pound.

• \$154,299 was spent by CCC in 2024 to assist our neighbors with rent payments and \$86,475 on power and water bill assistance.

CCC sees an average of 18-20 clients each day.

CCC also assists with school supplies, holiday food, holiday gift assistance and home repairs.

We serve Central, Clemson, and Pendleton residents. None of this can be provided without the continued support of churches and individuals in the Clemson area.
