FROM PASTOR JOSH

The stories we'll hear during Holy Week are familiar ones: Jesus riding into Jerusalem on a donkey as the crowds lay their palms on the ground, the intimacy of the Last Supper, the excruciating details of the crucifixion, the mystery of what happens in the tomb, the overwhelming joy of the resurrection.

Each of these stories invites us to examine our relationship with Jesus, and they each act as a window into who Jesus is in his life, death, and resurrection.

Who, then, is Jesus for you? What does your relationship with Jesus mean for you? How does it affect the way that you live your life? And how are we, as a community of faith, called to respond to what we hear in the week ahead?

THIS SUNDAY, Palm Sunday, immediately after the 11:00 service, you are invited to join us to celebrate Tiffany and her impending bundle of joy in the fellowship hall. There will be light refreshments and a time to show our support for them.

Eating local foods not only gives you foods that taste better, buying local products helps support the local economy (allowing your purchases to help community members near you). And it protects the earth (by decreasing the cost of transporting so much food from California, South America, Europe, etc.). Although locally grown food often costs more, the better taste makes it worthwhile. There's nothing like a fresh lettuce, tomato, peach, or pepper that hasn't traveled long distances to get to market! This week, we'll be providing samples of some local foods, breads, and products along with information about nearby farmers markets which will open soon.

Here's some information about community-sponsored markets in our area. There are also many other commercial vendors in our area that feature fresh produce, as well as a variety of locally made baked goods, homemade jams and jellies, etc.

If you use Facebook, many markets have information pages with current information about available products. These include commercial operations, as well as community-sponsored markets.

MOVIE SUGGESTION FOR LENT

Many folks may not have heard of the movie "The Shack"; a 2017 American drama film based on the 2007 novel of the same name. After suffering a family tragedy, Mack Phillips spirals into a deep depression that causes him to question his innermost beliefs. Facing a crisis of faith, he receives a mysterious, personal invitation to meet with God at "The Shack." This invitation will bring him face to face with God, where God's manifestations appear in nontraditional forms. The film deals with some deep spiritual issues about the nature of God and in particular about sacrificial love, making it very appropriate for the Lenten Season. Of course some predictable clichés are thrown in; and there is a surprise ending. The theology presented may not be completely 'Lutheran'; but it will make you think about spiritual things more deeply – which after all is the main point of Lent.

"The Shack" is available on Netflix and probably on a lot of other streaming services as well.

CLEMSON COMMUNITY CARE FACTS

- In 2024, CCC distributed 341,241 pounds of food. The average food distributed per day is 1,600 pounds.
- Food is valued at \$1.97 per pound.
- \$154,299 was spent by CCC in 2024 to assist our neighbors with rent payments and \$86,475 on power and water bill assistance.
- CCC sees an average of 18-20 clients each day.

CCC also assists with school supplies, holiday food, holiday gift assistance and home repairs.

We serve Central, Clemson, and Pendleton residents. None of this can be provided without the continued support of churches and individuals in the Clemson area.

Grocery bags are available in the narthex with current pantry needs list attached. Please consider taking one and return it filled for distribution to CCC.
