UPDATE - CAMPUS PASTOR CALL PROCESS

Your Congregational Council is committed to keeping you informed as to the progress of the call process for a new Campus Pastor, as well as what steps must be realized in the future.

We are delighted to announce that the Call Committee has unanimously voted to refer a primary candidate for Campus Pastor to both Bishop Ginny Aebischer and the UniLu Congregational Council for consideration.

Mark your calendars for Sunday, July 20. Should the candidate gain their blessings, we will invite them to deliver the reflection at both worship services that Sunday.

They would also be available for a meet-and-greet with questions in between services.

In compliance with our constitution, we would then schedule a congregational vote for Sunday, August 10 at 10:00 a.m. between worship services. The primary candidate must be affirmed by a two-thirds majority at a minimum and the compensation package by a simple majority.
