"It is so great to serve other people. And they are so appreciative." - Jean Mehlman Most of you know - each week during the schoolyear a group of folks provides a warm, home-cooked meal for students that we have grown to know and love.

Perhaps we don't talk as much about another ministry – once a month, in a different setting, a handful of folks gathers on a Friday morning to prepare a warm, home-cooked meal for a collection of mostly strangers at Our Daily Bread Soup Kitchen in Seneca.

Some folks whisk together an instant cornbread recipe or toss together a salad. Others stir a pan of ingredients for a casserole. A couple of hands spend time at the sink perpetually washing dishes to keep the space clean. And by lunch time, there is a meal to serve.

People from the surrounding area start to line up early, sit down with a tray of food and an ice-cold eup of tea or a hot cup of coffee, and take this opportunity to rest and refresh. While it's only a moment in the middle of an exhausting week, it's a chance to be seen, be cared for, and be fed.

By 1:00, the room is empty, the mopped floor is drying, and it's almost as if none of it even happened, until things get started again the next day.

What a simple, meaningful way to show love to our neighbors – just a few hours, one Friday a month. Have you ever wondered, "Mot can I do to make a difference in the world?" Well, this is one way our church tries to answer that question. And in the end, you're sure to be asking yourself, "Okay, what's next?"

#### SAVE THE DATE - PASTOR MEGAN'S INSTALLATION


