Each week, about three-quarters of the way through our Sunday morning worship, we settle into a rhythm of Holy Communion. We rise from our seats, walk towards the table at the front, stand or kneel in reverence, and receive a bit of bread and wine - a tangible sign of God's presence and grace. It's something you might miss if you're unable to worship in person for any particular reason.

Several beloved members of this church live in the Clemson Downs retirement community Many of these folks represent the history and legacy of University Lutheran over decades. They are not often able to worship with us in the Sanctuary. And they are faces that we wish we could see gathered around the table with us during Communion.

For the past two years a group of us have been visiting and hosting a monthly time of conversation and a Communion Service at the Downs. Lifelong Lutherans show up, and so do some of their friends. While it looks different than what we expect each week in the Sanctuary, the words and the warmth of God's grace are familiar. We start with coffee and treats. We swap stories and prayer requests. And then we set the table with the wine and the bread.

There is something meaningful about a community of faith that is tied together through moments like these. Our church is here because of saints who have been around much longer than most of us. And our relationships stretch far beyond our Sunday morning routines. Join us on the third Wednesday of each month!

SAVE THE DATE - PASTOR MEGAN'S INSTALLATION


