Advent is a season of anticipation and preparation. As we celebrate Jesus' birth two thousand years ago, we also make room for Jesus to show up in our lives right now. But

what can we be doing to ready ourselves for the excitement?

In the coming weeks, we've got several opportunities to figure out what might be meaningful for you this Advent:

- The Wednesday Bible Study (Noon on Wednesdays, Fellowship Hall) will focus on some of the songs around Jesus' birth like Mary's Magnificat and Zechariah's Benedictus
- We'll have Midweek Advent Worship featuring Holden Evening Prayer on Wednesday nights after a Community Meal
- Each Sunday we'll sing hymns, read passages, and light candles to center us on the Advent message
- And there are other seasonal things to get us into the holiday spirit like a
 Congregational Christmas Dinner on Saturday, December 6; or we'll have a
 chance to go Christmas Caroling on Sunday, December 14

CONGREGATIONAL MEETING - SUNDAY, DEC. 7

Dear Siblings in Christ,

This email serves as notice that we will hold a Congregational meeting at 10:00 am on December 7th between services. At this meeting we will vote on three new Council members and the 2026 proposed budget, so please plan on attending if you can. There will be a few other updates about the life of the congregation as well.

Click the tabs below to review two important documents to be approved: the minutes from our meeting in April and our 2026 Proposed Budget. You can also find the bios for the Council Nominees in the section just below.

In the proposed budget, all employees receive a 3% raise. The committees are also given a 3% guideline for increases with the caveat that they explain any requests beyond the 3%. Comparisons with 2025 for salaries and benefits is very futile since a good part of the year we had just one pastor.

The Stewardship Committee supplied the estimated amounts for pledge and plate income for 2026 based on the current Stewardship Campaign. These stewardship amounts and the proposed budget will leave us with a positive balance of \$24,283. This gives us some interesting options!


2026 Proposed Budget




NOMINEES FOR NEW COUNCIL TERMS

Locking & Unlocking UniLu's Exterior Access Doors

We need your help... whenever entering UniLu's buildings in the off hours it is imperative that we use the automatic, electrical locks whenever possible. Contact the church office for the code. The code will will unlock the door. Those of us resorting to the use of pre-

existing keys are all too often forgetting to lock back up. Our pastors and staff are routinely finding doors unlocked at all hours of the night, which is both a security and a safety issue. So, please use the electronic locks in the off hours. Thanks!

Weekday (Monday-Friday, 8:00-5:00) Parking at University Lutheran

Just a reminder... to avoid a weekday parking ticket you must park in one of the nine UniLu parking slots at the back of the upper lot or in the lower lot near the administrative offices/LCM lounge. Be sure to prominently display your UniLu parking sticker (white rose) in the rear window of your car. They are available in the Narthex or chuch office.

If you are planning a short weekday visit (< 2 hours), you can use a slot in one of the first three rows of the upper lot for free. They are allotted on a first come, first serve basis.

Rows 4 and 5 of the upper lot are permanently leased to the city for weekday use (Monday-Friday, 8:00-5:00). If you park in any of those slots during the weekday hours you be subject to a parking ticket and or towed or both.


SUNDAY SCHOOL OPPORTUNITIES
